

After Census 2000, the Census Bureau changed the way it collects data. The long-form questionnaire that collected socio-economic data has been eliminated and Census 2010 only collected population, race and ethnicity and occupancy status data. The socio-economic data that used to be collected with the long-form questionnaire is now collected with a rolling survey called the American Community Survey, or ACS for short. The Census Bureau began collecting ACS data in 2005. For geographic areas with less than 20,000 people (Inyo County) it took 5-years to collect enough data for a statistically significant sample size. The 2005-2009 ACS data came out in time for the 2010 Census. The following Demographic report uses data from both the 2010 Census and the 2009 release of American Community Survey data.

## Census 2010 Demographic Report – Inyo County

Inyo County recently conducted a demographic report using 2010 Decennial Census data and 2009 American Community Survey data, to better understand the characteristics of the people who live there. This report looks at key demographic factors such as: population change, age, race and ethnicity, household types, income and poverty, educational attainment, occupation and housing types. These factors were calculated for Inyo County and for comparison purposes, unincorporated Inyo County, the California and Nevada counties that surround Inyo and the State of California. A summary of the findings from these calculations is described below and detailed tables for all of the factors in all of the various geographies can be found in the appendix at the end of this report.

**Change over time** – the population of Inyo County showed modest growth between the 2000 and 2010 Censuses. The population in 2000 was 17,895 and 18,546 in 2010, an increase of 3.3%, or 601 people. This is after a decrease of -1.8% in population between Census 1990 and 2000.

**Where the growth occurred** – most of Inyo County’s growth occurred within the City of Bishop. Of the 601 persons increase in the County, 304 occurred in Bishop, representing approximately half of all the overall growth. Bishop’s population increased by 8.5% between Census 2000 and 2010 (3,575 to 3,879 respectively). Unincorporated Inyo County (all the area minus Bishop) grew 2.0%, from 14,370 to 14,667, a total of 297 people.

With the exception of Esmeralda County, Nevada (Esmeralda had a population loss of -19.4%), the counties surrounding Inyo in both California and Nevada showed much higher growth rates than Inyo, between Census 2000 and 2010. The following table shows the population change between Census 2000 and 2010 for counties surrounding Inyo and Census designated places in Inyo County.

**By Supervisor District** – of the five districts, District 2, which includes Bishop, had the greatest increase in population of 9.6%.

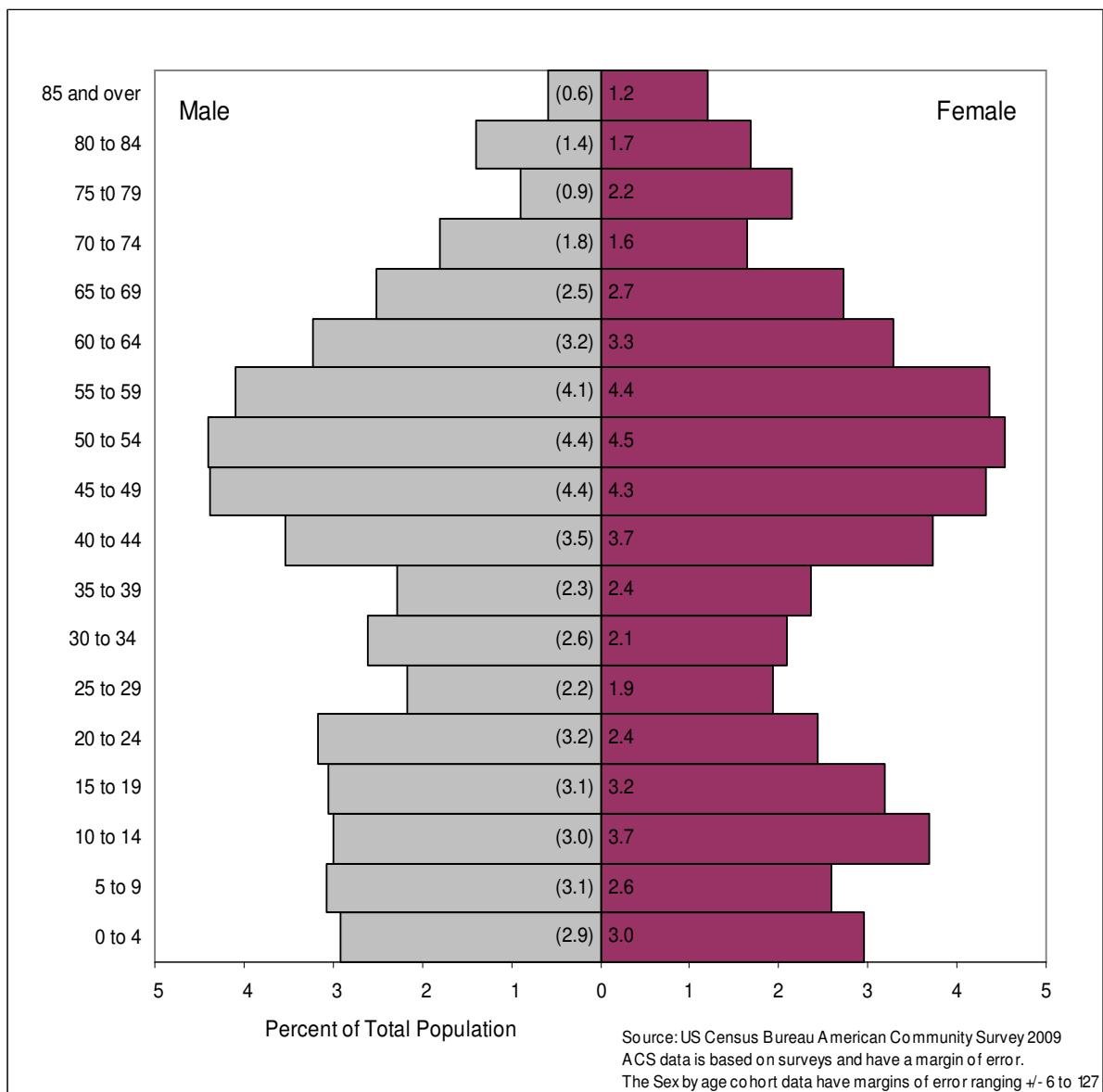

**Who lives here** – Inyo County has a population that is skewed towards ‘middle aged’. The age cohorts with the greatest percentage of people are the 40-44, 45-49, 50-54 and 55-59 together they represent 33.4% of the population. The median age (half are above and half are below) is 44.5 years old. There is also a fair percentage of children and infants under 20-years. The age cohorts that are unusually low are the 20-24, 25-29, 30-34 and 35-39. This group together represents 19% of the population. This indicates that many of Inyo County’s young adults leave and come back as they get older, or that people of middle age move in from other places. There is also a correlation with Inyo county’s middle-aged population and the Baby Boom generation. The Baby Boom occurred between 1946 and 1964 creating an increase in population throughout the U.S. These Baby Boomers are currently (2010) aged 46-64-years.

Inyo County has a relatively high median age of 44.5-years. The State’s median age is 34.6 years and all of the surrounding California counties have lower median ages than Inyo. The two Nevada counties have higher median ages than Inyo (Esmeralda 54.5 and Nye 47.4).

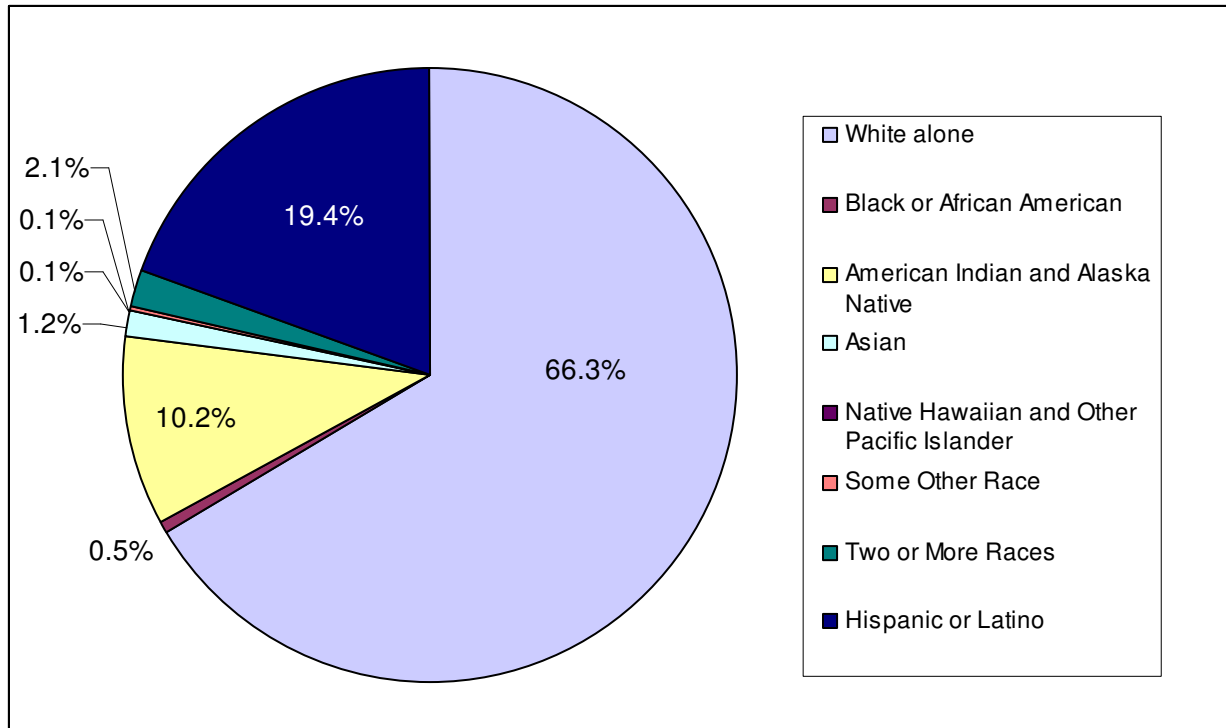

**Who lives here** – Inyo County has experienced an increase in the population that identifies itself as a race or ethnicity other than White (Hispanic-Latino is considered an ethnicity, and can be of either Black/African American or White race). This is especially evident in the Hispanic-Latino population. In 1990 the Hispanic-Latino population represented 8.4% of Inyo County’s overall population, in 2000 12.6% and in 2010 19.4%. Between 1990 and 2010 the Hispanic-Latino population grew by 134%. Inyo County also has a large population of people who identify themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native. The percentage of people who identify themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native has been fairly consistent between 1990 and 2010 with moderate growth. In 1990 9.1% of the population identified itself as American Indian or Alaska Native in 2000 9.4 and in 2010 10.2%

Compared to the surrounding California counties Inyo has one of the lower percentages of people who identify themselves as Hispanic-Latino (19.4%). Only the two Nevada counties have lower percentages than Inyo (Esmeralda 15.3% and Nye 13.6%). Inyo County has a far larger population of people who identify themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native (10.2%) than all of the surrounding counties. The Furnace Creek and the Lone Pine CDPs are the most ethnically diverse areas in Inyo County. Furnace Creek has 66.7% of its population identifying themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native and 8.3% indentifying themselves as Two or more Races. Lone Pine has the largest population of people identifying themselves as Hispanic-Latino (34.1%) and 9.3% identifying themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native. See Table 1 in the appendix for the percentage of population by race and ethnicity, for the counties surrounding Inyo and Census Designated Places.

**Who lives here** – People who identified themselves a foreign born represent 9.2% of Inyo County’s population. This is considerably lower than all of the other surrounding counties except Nye County, Nevada (8.3%). The Census Designated Place of Olancha has the highest percentage of people indentifying themselves as foreign born (35.4%); Furnace Creek, Pearsonville, Shoshone and Wilkerson have none. Most of the people in Inyo County, who indentified themselves as foreign born, indicated that they were born in Mexico (62%).

***How do we live*** – Most of the people living in Inyo County live in a family household (61.7%). The Census Bureau defines a family as a group of people who are related by birth, marriage or adoption. A household, as defined by the Census Bureau, is an occupied housing unit. Married couple families represent 47.1% of all households. See Table 2 in the appendix for Households by type for counties surrounding Inyo and Census Designated Places.

***How do we live*** – Households with children under 18-years living in them represent 28.6% of all households in Inyo County and 18% are in married couple households. This is lower than all of the surrounding California counties, as well as the statewide percentage (26.1%) but higher than the two Nevada counties (Esmeralda 14.3% and Nye 14.7%). Married couple households with children under 18-years are commonly considered more stable than other household types with children. Inyo County also has a lower percentage of households with children under 18-years living in them overall. The

Census designated place of Cartago has the highest percentage of households with children under 18-years (63.6%) living in them; Darwin, Keeler, Pearsonville and Shoshone have none. See Table 3 in the appendix for Households by type with children under 18 living in them, for counties surrounding Inyo and Census Designated Places.

**How do we live** – The average household size in Inyo County is small (2.2 persons per household). This is fairly low compared to California overall and the surrounding California Counties. Only Esmeralda County, Nevada of all the surrounding counties has a smaller average household size (1.9) than Inyo. Within Inyo County the Census Designated Places, Independence and Tecopa have the smallest average household size (1.8 and 1.4 respectively) and Dixon Lane-Meadow Creek and Big Pine have the largest (2.6 and 2.4 respectively). None are 3 or above.

**How well do we live** – Inyo County has a median income (half are above and half are below) of \$44,952, which is lower than all of the surrounding California counties and California’s overall (\$60,392). It is higher than the two surrounding Nevada counties. Of



the Census Designated Places, Olancha has the highest median income (\$68,750) and Darwin has the lowest (\$21,042).

***How well do we live*** – Per capita income in Inyo County falls in at about the middle of the surrounding counties and California overall incomes. West Bishop has the highest per capita income of the Census Designated Places (\$34,370) and Darwin has the least (\$16,861).

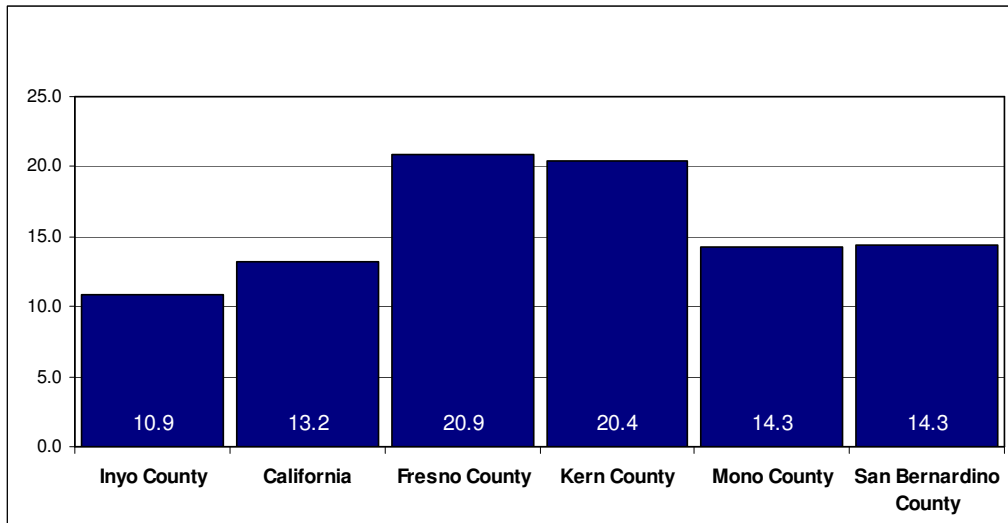

***How well do we live*** – With the exception of Esmeralda County, Nevada, Inyo County has the lowest poverty rate (10.9) of all the surrounding counties and the State overall. A poverty level of 10.9% is still quite high, however. Although the household and per capita incomes were not the highest in Inyo County, it appears that people living in Inyo County can afford to live on what they are earning somewhat better than those in the surrounding counties. Tecopa has the highest rate of poverty (20.5%) of all the Census Designated Places. Cartago, Keeler, Olancha, Pearsonville and Shoshone reported no one living in poverty.

**How well do we live** – The majority of people who are 25-years or older living in Inyo County have graduated high school (89.2%). In unincorporated Inyo County the percentage is 90.4% and in the City of Bishop it is 84.1%. The City of Bishop has a higher percentage of people with advanced degrees than unincorporated Inyo, but it also has the highest percentage of people who did not graduate high school. **How do we work** – The highest percentages of people who live in Inyo County overall and in unincorporated Inyo County, work in sales and office occupations (28.8%, 31.4% respectively). The highest percentage of people by occupation, for people who live in the City of Bishop, is in management and professional occupations (36.4%). See Table 5 in the appendix for a complete breakdown of occupation type for counties surrounding Inyo and Census Designated Places in Inyo County.

**How do we work** – The highest percentages of people who work in Inyo County, work in the industry categories of Retail Trade (14.1%) and Health Care and Social Assistance (14%).

**Where do we work** – Most people in Inyo County work fairly close to home. The highest percentage of people in Inyo County overall and the City of Bishop reported that they travel between 5 and 9 minutes to work (28.3% and 36.6% respectively). People in unincorporated Inyo County are even closer. The highest percentage of people, who live in unincorporated Inyo County, report that they travel less than 5 minutes to get to work (26.3%). A higher percentage of people in unincorporated Inyo County carpool (15.3%) to work, and a higher percentage of people in the City of Bishop walk or bicycle to work (10.4% and 11.6% respectively). **What we live in** – Most of the occupied housing units in Inyo County overall and unincorporated Inyo County are owner occupied. Inyo County has an owner/renter ratio of 64% owner 36% renter and unincorporated Inyo County has a ratio of 69% owner 31% renter. These ratios are fairly common. In most suburban areas a split close to 60% owner 40% renter is common. Bishop’s ratio is the opposite. It has a higher renter than owner percentage of 43% owner 57% renter ratio. A ratio that is higher renter to owner is more common in heavily urbanized areas and areas with high housing prices. **What we live in** – Most housing units in Inyo County overall and unincorporated Inyo County are single-family detached units (59.4% and 66.3% respectively). This is especially evident in unincorporated Inyo County as Bishop is removed from it. Bishop

has far greater percentages of housing units in multi-family structures. Counting duplexes through structures with 50 or more units, Bishop has a multi-family housing percentage of 42.8%. Compared to unincorporated Inyo County's 4.4%, this is a very large difference. Unincorporated Inyo County has a higher percentage of mobile homes (26.5%) compared to Bishop's (17.2%).
